
5. If you lose your registration e-mail, then no worries! Just repeat the steps above and your confirmation e-mail will be re-sent to you.

APBP Free Webinar: Exploring AASHTO's Updated Guide for the Development of Bicycle Facilities, 5th Edition

Join APBP and Toole Design for a free webinar exploring the Guide for the Development of Bicycle Facilities, 5th Edition.

The American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) has released the fifth edition of the Guide for the Development of Bicycle Facilities, which supersedes the fourth edition published in 2012. Developed by the AASHTO Committee on Design and the Technical Committee on Non-Motorized Transportation and based on extensive research, the latest edition of what is colloquially known as the 'AASHTO Bike Guide' provides the preeminent engineering design guidance on the physical infrastructure needed to support bicycling for travel and recreation in the United States.

The guide encourages a flexible approach to design bikeways and emphasizes the role of the planner, designer, and engineer in determining appropriate bikeway types and design dimensions based on project-specific conditions and existing and future performance. AASHTO's new Bike Guide is available to order online in multiple physical and digital formats.
